Notice is hereby given that Energiekontor UK Ltd, (“the Company”) with company registration number 03830819, having its registered office at 114 St Martin's Lane, Covent Garden, London, United Kingdom, WC2N 4BE has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate an onshore wind farm comprising 13 wind turbines and a Battery Energy Storage System at Glenvernoch, Newton Stewart (Central Grid Reference NX 35304 73033). The installed capacity of the proposed generating station would be approximately 86 MW comprising turbines with a ground to blade tip height of 200 metres. The proposed development is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and an EIA Report has been produced.

Energiekontor UK Ltd has now submitted additional information to Scottish Ministers, which includes information relating to further information to address consultee comments relating to peat and groundwater dependent terrestrial ecosystems. Alongside the additional information is a suite of viewpoint location plans, amended visualisations and a Battery Energy Storage System elevation plan. These plans and visualisations are for clarification and illustrative purposes only, and do not constitute additional information.

As a result of a statutory objection from the relevant planning authority, or where Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, Scottish Ministers can also cause a Public Local Inquiry (PLI) to be held.

Following examination of the environmental information, Scottish Ministers will determine the application for consent in two ways:

- Consent the proposal, with or without conditions attached; or
- Reject the proposal

All previous representations received in relation to this development remain valid.
